Submission guidelines

Abstracts must:

- Be submitted in English
- Be limited to 300 words (excluding information about authors and final key words)
- Use font Arial, size 10
- Have the title in bold-print, and font size 12.
- List author(s) starting with name of presenter: first and last name, degrees and/or titles, name of organisation, city, country, and e-mail address
- Include:
 - o Problem statement and aim
 - Approach/method(s) used
 - Results and conclusion(s)/implication(s)
 - o Alternatively, more practical papers may use other headings
 - Up to 5 key words for the abstract/paper, (concepts such as 'Work organisation' here count as only one word).

Full papers must include:

- An abstract and be limited to 10 pages
- The usual headings e.g., Introduction, methods, results, discussion and conclusions, or for more practical papers other headings may be used
- A peer-review.

Posters must include:

- An abstract with key headings and sections clearly outlined.
- The formatted poster can simply be presented at the conference.

Workshops must include:

• An abstract and a 'run sheet' for the workshop clearly outlined.

Submissions are to be made electronically to <u>conference2023@hfesnz.org.nz</u>. Accepted abstracts and papers will be published in the conference proceedings.

Student prizes
